Event Summary

First, we meet **online** for our **Tuesday evening Committee Breakouts**. Then, **Friday night and all-day Saturday will be hybrid**, where you have the choice of attending online or in person.

You must complete the Zoom registration if you plan on attending the Committee Breakouts, whether you are attending the weekend in person or online. Registration details are on the detailed agenda after this cover letter.

If you wish to attend in person, you'll find us at the **Croatian Cultural Center** at 3250 Commercial Drive in Vancouver.

In the resources section you'll find list of nearby hotels and restaurants. The Area Service Committee will be staying at the Sandman Hotel on West Georgia St.

Many of us, me included, are new to our roles; it can feel overwhelming. Fear not, we've got you. There are three sessions I'd encourage you to attend, even if you're not new to service at this level:

- **Tuesday at 6pm** is a **First Timer's Orientation**. This occurs before the event officially begins. I strongly encourage new members to attend.
- **Friday at 7pm** is a **Service Orientation** following by an area **Website Orientation**. Both are going to be very helpful as you embark on this journey.
- **Saturday** after dinner is a **What's on your mind?** sharing session where you have an opportunity to ask questions about your new role. Remember: if you're unsure about something, chances are someone else has the same question. Ask!
